



INTRODUCTION

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought fast and sweeping changes to work around the world. Many have lost their jobs, while others suddenly have more work than they can handle. Some jobs have become much more dangerous with virus exposure, while social distancing steps have led many to navigate remote work or school. Financial and provisional needs are now paramount to survival for an increasing number. And some are experiencing the ultimate loss of a colleague or loved one. The one common denominator is the upheaval of the social order we had taken for granted in our work.

In the midst of an uncertain future, driving ourselves into a deeper relationship with our Savior is the way to process our hurts, our anxieties, our losses and our confusion. The Lord is our Shepherd who leads us through the valley of the shadow of death (Psalm 23).

We have crafted this devotional for this unique time in the hope that it will encourage you to allow God to speak into every aspect of your life today. We serve a God who came to earth to suffer. He offers a model of calling out to God in our troubles through Job, through the Psalms, through the Apostle Paul. Even Jesus cried out to God — “If it is possible, let this cup pass from me” (Matthew 26:39).

This 15-day devotional will help you consider how God is using his word to call you to daily faithfulness. How can you faithfully serve God in the things he is asking you to do today? How can his Word guide your motivations, your actions and your relationships today? If each day belongs to him, what is he asking you to do with him and for him today? Scripture passages highlight people who were called by the Lord to do difficult and sometimes seemingly impossible things. The goal of this devotional is to develop a discipline of seeking his will and guidance through meditation of God’s word and reflection of your days.

We hope that in this difficult time you will experience new and unexpected mercies — evidence of God’s faithfulness and love for you, that his dominion over all things will shine through your circumstances, and that the grace of our loving Savior will become even more real to you. We hope cultivating a habit of seeking his guidance in your daily life will increase your experience of his presence, sovereignty and love.

Genesis 12:1–9

The Call of Abram

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. ² And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great,

so that you will be a blessing. ³ I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

⁴ So Abram went, as the Lord had told him, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran.

⁵ And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their possessions that they had gathered, and the people that they had acquired in Haran, and they set out to go to the land of Canaan. When they came to the land of Canaan, ⁶ Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. ⁷ And I will draw out Sisera, the general of Jabin's army, to meet you by the river Kishon with his chariots and his troops, and I will give him into your hand?" ⁸ Barak said to her, "If you will go with me, I will go, but if you will not go with me, I will not go." ⁹ And she said, "I will surely go with you. 1 Samuel 16:1–13

David Anointed King

The Lord said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul, since I have rejected him from being king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil, and go. I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons."

² And Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears

it, he will kill me." And the Lord said, "Take a heifer with you and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the Lord.'³ And invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and

I will show you what you shall do. And you shall anoint for me him whom

I declare to you."⁴ Samuel did what the Lord commanded and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling and said, "Do you come peaceably?"⁵ And he said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the Lord. Consecrate yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice." And he consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

⁶ When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is before him."⁷ But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." ⁴² Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done." ⁴³ And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. ⁴⁴ So, leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words again. ⁴⁵ Then he came to the disciples and said to them, "Sleep and take your rest later on. See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. ⁴⁶ Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand."
